OUR FOCUS

To help veterans transition back to civilian life more successfully through being with and working with horses. To provide people in recovery from addictions a solid path to staying clean and sober for the long haul through working with and being with horses. To provide them a path to a purposeful, stable and fulfilling life through the principles of good horsemanship and a job with housing.

To provide equine therapy to all ages and need groups in Shelby County and beyond.

To teach professional horse caretaking skills in a therapeutic environment, provide equine assisted therapy, and promote both human and equine well-being.

To strive to be a community hub, where families can bring their kids on our community days and enjoy the horses, people and healthy atmosphere.

In 2024, 19 men entered the program, 12 were placed in jobs in the horse industry.

5 are still in training and 2 left early. 2023 had 14 men enter the program while 2022 had 10. Our goal is to serve 35 in 2025.

We are expanding! Construction is commencing on living space for 4 more men in Phase 1. We are so excited to be able to help more men realize their potential for their life!


